MESSAGE OVERVIEW

In Matthew 6:19-24 Jesus delivers an important insight into getting our hearts in the right place. He said "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." The implication is this: get your treasure in the right place and your heart will follow. The antidote to a misplaced heart is proper resource allocation.

READ MATTHEW 6:19-24

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

What is the difference between serving money and being wealthy? Can someone be wealthy without serving money? Can someone serve money without being wealthy?

What is the difference between our hearts following our treasure and our treasure following our hearts? What could be the danger in getting this backwards?

How can having healthy eyes (vv. 22-23) help us store up treasures in heaven? How can it help us serve God and refuse to serve money?

In his sermon on lust and adultery, Neil encouraged us to develop the habit of "bouncing our eyes" when faced with sexual temptation. Could a similar practice help us serve God rather than money? How?

APPLICATION

What is God saying to you through this passage of scripture?

In light of what you've heard, how are you going to be different in the future?
